Firework Safety

With Autumn upon us we are in firework season, with Bonfire night, Halloween and the Festive Period all often a time for people to celebrate with fireworks – which often for pets cause stress and anxiety. Below are some tips and hints to help keep your pets safe and as stress free as possible during firework season:

- Give dogs and cats their tea early on evenings when you know fireworks are planned in the local area (joining local facebook pages can help you establish planned local events) and then shut the curtains, close the cat flaps and pop on the telly or the radio for background noise.
- Provide your pets with an area to hide and feel secure in if they wish – this can be a blanket draped over something to provide a shelter. Don't forget our outdoor pets such as rabbits and guinea pigs, pop a blanket or cover over three quarters of their living area to provide some sense of security for them.
- Ensure your pets contact microchip details are up to date with the providers data base, so if your pet does happen to escape or run off they can be easily reunited – if you are unsure how to do this just speak to a team member who can help you.
- Check for wildlife before lighting any bonfires as animals such as hedgehogs can burrow into bonfire stacks thinking it is a ready made home.
- Consider calm medications or supplements – there are lots of good options available now, speak with a clinical team member if you think your pet may benefit from some calming aids.

Pet Health Plan

We all know that preventative health care is gold standard care for our pets, but we also all understand this can be costly purchasing things in one go.
